

## About Fr. Roy Bourgeois:

*A native Louisianan, Roy was a naval officer for four years, including duty in Vietnam. He received the Purple Heart. He was ordained a Maryknoll Catholic priest in 1972, served in Bolivia, was arrested and forced to leave the country for his defense of the poor. He has spent over four years in U.S. prisons for nonviolent protests against the training of Latin American soldiers at Ft. Benning, GA. In 1990, he founded the School of Americas Watch (SOAW), which does research on the U.S. SOA. He received the 1997 Pax Christi USA Teacher of Peace Award*
